

Free Meals for Children



Wayne Central is proud to partner with the USDA to provide free meals for children 18 and younger this summer. Meals are provided at no charge every Wednesday, July 14 to August 18.

Drive-through meal pick-up will be at Wayne Central High School, located at 6200 Ontario Center Road.

A limited number of meals are available. We will monitor demand and adjust the number of meals provided. Our goal is to provide meals for any child who needs them.

This program is fully funded by the USDA, so there is no cost to district taxpayers.

- ✓ No paperwork or proof of enrollment necessary.
- ✓ Child need not be present to receive a meal.
- ✓ Take one 7 day meal pack for every child in your household.

BREAKFAST & LUNCH OFFERINGS

- Wayne Central will provide 7 servings of breakfast and lunch for each child every Wednesday.
- Meals will include fruits and vegetables from local farms.
- Offerings may be served cold with instructions to heat.

MEAL PICK-UP INFORMATION

- Meals will be available for pick-up at the High School between 10:00 AM and 12:00 PM every Wednesday.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

- Q: If we are unable to pick up should we notify you?**
A: If you cannot pick up one week, you do not need to notify us.
- Q: Can you deliver meals to my home?**
A: NO, we are not able to deliver meals for the summer program.
- Q: What if my child has a special dietary need?**
A: Accommodations can be made if request is accompanied by a written physician's statement. Please contact nwilson@waynecsd.org for more information.
