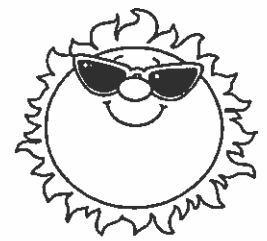

### Stay Happy, Safe, and Healthy for Summer

Wear sunscreen and remember to wear helmets and protective gear for sports activities. Summer is a great time to teach your child to swim and to teach the use of life jackets around the water and while boating.

### After-School Transportation/Pick-up

As the weather gets nicer, we understand that more parents like to pick their children up from school. To keep our dismissal process running smoothly, we ask that parents email [wesbuspasses@williamsoncentral.org](mailto:wesbuspasses@williamsoncentral.org), by 1:00 p.m., for any changes in after-school transportation.



## Notes

Students can be picked up from school during the school day with a written note stating the time of pick-up, nature of the early dismissal, and the name of the person or persons that will be picking the child up from school. We ask that students not be picked up between 3:00 pm and dismissal at 3:20 pm. Please send notes by 1:00 pm per school policy.

## New Health Requirements

### UPK, K, 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup>

NY State legislation requires proper immunizations and physicals in order to attend school. The legislation requires that your child receive proper immunizations at correct intervals at appropriate ages. A physical appraisal form is required for all students entering UPK, K (only if student was NOT enrolled in UPK), 1<sup>st</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> grades. This physical appraisal form must be completed within 1 year prior to school start or 30 days after school start. This requires that the form be dated after 9/4/2018. Please check with your child's physician to make sure all these requirements have been met. It is best to contact the physician as soon as possible because summer appointments fill up quickly.

## Medications

As the year end is near, pick up arrangements need to be made if your child has any current medications in the Health Office. Please make arrangements with the Health Office by Monday, 6/24/2019. Any medications not picked up by the last day of school, 6/25/2019, must be destroyed according to regulations.



TIES (Together Including Every Student) is a program which promotes the participation of children/young adults who have developmental disabilities in extracurricular and community activities by providing effective peer support. This support is provided by trained student volunteers in grades 8-12 in the Williamson Central School District.

Participants and volunteers join in a wide variety of activities, such as school trips, Scouting, arts and crafts classes, sports programs, swimming, after-school activities, drumming circles, school of religion, etc. Please note that TIES is also available over the summer and proudly partners with our local REC programs.
